## **Clinic Schedule**

1. 0800 Gate opens for parking horse trailers- If you want to arrive on Friday you need to make prior arrangements with clinic management. . Riders pick up packets from the gate keeper.
2. 0830-0900 Clinic Check in. Coffee and donuts available at the information desk
3. 0930-10:00 Participants to bring horse to arena with halter, lead rope and whip if needed, you will be working on in hand presentation of your horse.
4. 10:00 to -11:00- Saddle your horse and return for equipment check
5. 11:00 - Heading out on trail ride -You will ride out in groups of 3 to 5 with a mentor rider where you will have the opportunity to watch and practice multiple obstacle observation point with a separate instructor at each point.
6. 2:30- First riders back in Camp. Unsaddle and feed your horse.
7. 3:00- 4:?? Discussion of what was covered during the day. Instructors available for questions from participants.

# Day Use Agreement

## **Caution: This Contract Affects Your Legal Rights.**

**By signing it you are waiving legal rights and assuming legal liabilities. You are advised to read this contract carefully before signing, and will be presumed to have done so for purposes of any disputes arising out of this contract or the matters set forth herein.**

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This equine day use agreement, liability release and indemnity agreement ("Contract") is entered into and between Twining Ranch, Oracle Oak Ranch (a California S Corporation) and Twining Pastures, (collectively, "Ranch") and \_\_\_\_\_ ("User") as more fully set forth below. This Contract is deemed effective upon signing and shall continue to be in effect after any Horse or User has left "Premises" as defined below.

### DEFINITIONS

1. The term "BUSINESSES PROVIDING SERVICES AT THE RANCH" include each of the following persons and entities, all of which independently provide services at the Ranch:
  - A. The owners and shareholders of the Ranch, including but not limited to: Eloise Twining and Donald F. Robertson, their spouses, children and agents, employees and assigns;
  - B. Any farrier, veterinarian or trainer providing services on the Premises with the express approval of the Ranch;
  - C. Any organization providing services at or conducting activities on the Premises with the express approval of the Ranch, including but not limited to organizations conducting clinics or shows; and
  - D. All persons working for, voluntarily or otherwise providing services to Boarder or their Horse or the Ranch on behalf of any of the persons or entities identities identified in this paragraphs and, their shareholders, agents, employees, and assigns.
2. The term "HORSE" refers to any member of the equine species.
3. The term "EQUINE ACTIVITIES" shall refer to the handling, training and care of Horses, whether mounted or not, to the riding and exercising of Horses, and to being in the presence of Horses for any purpose whatsoever.
4. The term "PREMISES" shall include the properties located at 2375 Twining Road & 3701 East Side Road, Ukiah, California (commonly known as Twining Ranch, Oracle Oak Ranch & Twining Pastures) including all easements thereon, and all natural conditions and improvements thereon, including but not limited to arenas, round pens, penning facilities, barns, stalls, pastures, paddocks, fences, gates, tacking areas, cross-ties, feed and tack rooms, permanent jumps and obstacles, movable jumps and obstacles, open areas, walkways, paths, trails, roads, seating and picnic areas, creeks, waterways, man-made ponds and unimproved lands. To the extent that User may enter other properties (with or without permission) during the course of trail riding to/from Twining Ranch, Oracle Oak Ranch & /or Twining Pastures, those properties and the natural conditions and improvements thereon are included in the definition of Premises for the limited purpose of any claim or action against Ranch or the persons and entities that have an ownership or possessory interest in those properties. The term Premises also includes the private home and detached carport /shop which are on the property, and all natural conditions and improvements thereon. However no term of this contract gives any User or Horse the right to enter or use those private premises.
5. The terms "USER" refers to any person that enters the Premises. A parent or legal guardian of a minor under 18 years of age shall sign this Contract on behalf of their minor child user that shall enter the Premises.

### RANCH RULES:

1. All children under the age of 13 must be accompanied by and under the direct supervision of an adult at all times while they are on the Premises.
2. Helmets are very strongly advised for all ages, at all times when working around or riding Horses. At all times while mounted on a Horse, minors must wear helmets that meet the current ASTM and SEI standards, and helmets that meet the current ASTM and SEI standards must be worn by all adults while jumping horses.
3. Smoking is not permitted anywhere on the Premises. The consumption of alcohol is not permitted anywhere on the Premises unless it is during a Ranch approved event.
4. No shooting or hunting is allowed on the Premises, with the exception of the paid turkey and deer hunters. Other users are not allowed to shoot or hunt.
5. There is no trash disposal on the Premises. Please remove all personal trash when you leave.
6. Service dogs are welcome. Dogs owned by the owners of the Ranch, and those used by the cattle tenant for working cattle may run off leash. All other dogs must be leashed at all times, unless they have passed the Ranch's "Good Dog Test". To have your dog tested please contact Eloise Twining.
7. Leave cattle and horses boarded on Twining Pastures strictly alone. Report sick or injured cattle to Cody Jones 707-386-9817.
8. Do not leave your Horse in the barn/pens/paddocks/corrals without prior express approval by Eloise Twining.
9. The speed limit on the road is 15 miles an hour (or slower if necessary to ensure safety). Do not leave vehicle

- tracks in the grass for any reason. Day use parking is immediately to your right after you enter the property between the cattle corrals and Old River Road (vehicle tracks fine there!) Campers can use the area behind the corrals.
10. The entrance gate and boundary line gates must remain closed and locked at all times. All gates on the Ranch are normally left closed. If you find an open gate, leave it open and report it immediately to Eloise Twining.
  11. Problems or concerns should be promptly reported to Eloise Twining 415-613-1745.
  12. As a Day Use Member you may bring a friend with you only if they have signed the Day Use Agreement. You are responsible for paying the \$10 per day per rider fee each time they accompany you.
  13. Do not tie your horse to corral or arena fence panels. You may tie to posts.
  14. Water from faucets is available to thirsty horses. Please no bathing of horses unless it is an emergency.

Failure to comply with the rules will result in you being asked to leave immediately.

#### FEES:

Pay to: *Eloise Twining, 255A Henry Street, San Francisco, California 94114* Subscribers pay \$125 per person for an annual subscription. Day use for visitors is \$10 per person for each day they ride. A \$35 deposit is required for the key. Subscribers are responsible for any guests they bring with them. Guests must sign the release form prior or immediately after arriving. Subscribers are responsible for paying guest day use fees.

#### HUNTERS

No portion of the Horse boarding area is hunted on, however trail areas are hunted on during some portions of the year. User understands that at certain times of year they may need to be extra vigilant and visible when they use the trails because some portions of the Premises is used by hunters.

#### RIGHT TO REFUSE USE OF PREMISES

Ranch reserves the right to refuse to provide use of the Premises to any User at any time, with or without cause and with or without notice including during the course of a trail ride, lesson, clinic or show. The reasons Ranch may refuse to provide use of the Premises include, but are not limited to: violation of the rules and/or policies of Ranch; the physical or mental condition or acts of any Horse, person or animal; acts and conditions of nature; User's inability or refusal to follow the instructions of Ranch regarding acts or omissions of a User that affects the management, care, welfare or safety of a Horse or property; User's inability or refusal to follow the reasonable recommendations of Ranch regarding acts or omissions of a User that affect the health or safety of third parties or the enjoyment of Equine Activities by third parties.

#### ACKNOWLEDGEMENT AND ASSUMPTION OF RISKS

User understands that riding and being around Horses are inherently dangerous activities and User is voluntarily participating in such activities, with full knowledge of the dangers involved. Horses are powerful, easily frightened, and unpredictable animals, and all horses, even those that are well-trained and appear gentle, may buck, rear, stop short, change direction or speed at will. They may shy, spook, kick, strike, bite, and bolt--all without warning and without apparent cause, or in response to things that might or might not be apparent to the rider. **SERIOUS, PERMANENT BODILY INJURY, DISABILITY OR DEATH OF USER OR OTHERS MAY RESULT** from handling, riding or being in the vicinity of Horses, and that property belonging to User or others may be damaged as well.

It is stipulated that User brings her/his Horse onto the Premises relies upon trail maps provided by Ranch, uses trails during hunting season, and participates in Equine Activities at User's own risk. User acknowledges and stipulates that for the purposes of any claim or cause of action arising out of the matters that are the subject of this Contract, **User will be deemed to have inspected and found the Premises acceptable and safe for his /her intended use, and the intended use of any Horse that User may bring, or cause to be brought, onto the Premises.** User has a continuing duty to inspect said Premises, and will be deemed to have accepted and consented to the conditions of the Premises on an ongoing basis for such time as User or User's Horse continue to be on the Premises. **User assumes and accepts all of the risks, terms and conditions described in this Contract.** User assumes all of the aforementioned risks, terms and conditions on behalf of him/herself, his/her heirs, administrators, estate, assigns and representatives, and to the extent that a signatory hereto is executing this Contract in his/her capacity as the agent of another person, on behalf of each said person and said person's parents, guardians, heirs administrators, estate, assigns and representatives. All persons or entities with an ownership or possessory interest in the Premises and their agents, employees and assigns are intended as third party beneficiaries of this paragraph.

#### RELEASE OF LIABILITY

In further consideration of User and his/her Horse being permitted to enter the Premises, to participate in Equine Activities and the benefits that are provided under this Contract, each signatory hereto on behalf of him/herself, his/her heirs, administrators, estate, assigns and representatives and to the extent that a signatory is executing this

Contract in his/her capacity as the agent of another person, on behalf of each said persons, and said person's parents, guardians, heirs, administrators, estate, assigns and representatives **fully releases, acquits and discharges Ranch, all persons or entities with an ownership or possessory interest in the Premises, and their agents, employees and assigns, and any and all other persons, firms, entities or corporations who are or can ever in any way be liable to the undersigned, of and from all claims, demands, damages, actions and causes of action of every kind and nature** (including but not limited to rights of indemnity and contribution) known or unknown, existing, claimed to exist, or which can ever hereafter arise out of or result from or in connection with: the use of the Premises; hidden, latent or obvious defects in the Premises; hidden, latent or obvious defects in any equipment that may be provided by Ranch for User's use; the services to be provided by Ranch pursuant to this Contract; veterinary, farrier and transportation services or supplies obtained on User's behalf pursuant to this Contract; Equine Activities; or any of the other risks, terms and conditions described in this Contract or used by the Ranch which is incorporated by reference into this Contract; including but not limited to any and all liability for injuries, and damages to persons, Horses and /or property that may arise from strict liability, negligence, reckless, and /or intentional acts or omissions of Ranch and the other parties herein released, acts of third parties and acts of nature. All persons or entities with an ownership or possessory interest in the Premises and their agents, employees and assigns are intended as third party beneficiaries of this paragraph. It is the intent of this Contract that to the extent allowed by law, Ranch shall not be liable for any injury, illness, disease, damage, loss of use, death of User, a third party or a Horse that occurs while User, a third party or the Horse is on the Premises.

Each party to this Contract has been fully advised and understands that injuries and damages may be sustained and are waived by this Contract are of such a character that the full extent and type of such injures and damages, if any, are unknown at the date hereof, and may be of an unanticipated character or extent. Nevertheless, each party does hereby for himself/herself and each person on whose behalf she/he has executed this Contract, forever and fully release and discharge Ranch and their employees, agents and assigns, and understands by the execution of this instrument that no further claims may ever be asserted by the releasing parties or on their behalves. The undersigned agree as a further consideration that **provisions of Section 1542 of the Civil Code of the State of California are hereby expressly waived**, and the signatories hereto understand that said Section provides:

“A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his favor at the time of executing the release, which if know by him must have materially affected his settlement with the debtor.”                      **(Initial)**

#### INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In consideration of User and his/her Horse being permitted to enter the Premises, to participate in Equine Activities, and the benefits to be provided under this Contract, each User who has executed this Contract hereby agrees to **indemnify, provide a legal defense to, and hold Ranch, all persons or entities with an ownership or possessory interest in the Premises and all employees, agents or assigns of the Ranch harmless** from any damages, losses, injuries, demands, claims, settlements or judgments caused by or arising from the strict liability, negligence, reckless, and /or intentional acts or omissions of Ranch and the other parties herein released, acts of third parties and acts of nature.

#### ATTORNEYS FEES AND COSTS

In any claim or lawsuit arising out of the matters covered by this Contract or the alleged breach of this Contract, each prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the non-prevailing party her/his reasonable attorneys fees and costs incurred in the prosecution or defense of the matter.

#### CHOICE OF LAW

The laws of the State of California shall apply to any dispute arising out of matters that are the subject matter of this Contract or any dispute to enforce the terms of this Contract, and shall control the interpretation of this Contract. All actions arising out of this Contract must be filed in California Superior Court in the County of Mendocino. To the extent that any provision of this Contract may be rendered void or found to be unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall survive to the extent that the intent of the parties with regard to each such remaining provision has not been materially altered by the exclusion of the void/unenforceable provision.

#### COMPLETE AGREEMENT

This Contract constitutes and memorializes the entire agreement between the parties as to the matters provided for herein, and may only be modified by a subsequent written agreement. The parties bound by this Contract agree that no representations, statements or inducements, other than those expressly provided for herein, are relied upon in entering into this Contract.

## RIDER LIABILITY WAIVER

The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

"I HAVE READ the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. I AGREE to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. I UNDERSTAND that competitive riding is a high risk activity, which involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or man made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost, or stolen, and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time.

I AGREE to assume all risks associated with my participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, I agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE EVENT TAKES PLACE, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. I FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGE THAT I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS STATE'S EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING (IF APPLICABLE), A COPY OF WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE HEREIN. I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT MY HORSE IS NOT UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF MEDICATION AND WILL NOT BE TREATED WITH OR GIVEN ANY MEDICATION PROHIBITED BY NATRC™ RULES. I HEREBY GIVE PERMISSION TO THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE OR THEIR DULY APPOINTED AGENT, TO TAKE ANY APPROPRIATE ACTION DEEMED NECESSARY TO CHECK FOR POSSIBLE ADMINISTRATION OF DRUGS TO MY HORSE."

Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.

To the extent any dispute arises out of this agreement, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by the parties, said arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. All such arbitrations shall be held in the county or district where NATRC National headquarters are located. If the prevailing party, NATRC shall be allowed to recover all costs and expenses incurred, including attorney's fees and costs. "MY SIGNATURE BELOW CONSTITUTES ACCEPTANCE OF THE ABOVE TERMS AND CONDITIONS. I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTOOD THIS LIABILITY RELEASE AND BINDING ARBITRATION CLAUSE."

“Inherent risks of an equine activity” also means a danger or condition that is an integral part of an equine activity, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

- (a) Propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine;
- (b) The unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, person, or other animals;
- (c) Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions;
- (d) A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object;
- (e) The potential of an equine activity participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant.

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## Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19
