
Region 1 is privileged to have three top notch speakers on board.

1. Nancy Loving, DVM

Topic: Preparing Your Horse's Legs for Competition Discussion covers:

- -Appropriate conditioning for the musculoskeletal system
- -What to look for with limb inspection
- -Benefits and techniques of a warm-up
- -Detailed evidence-based pros and cons of leg boots

Dr. Loving's career covers many years in equine medicine as well as competing horses in dressage, eventing, and distance competitions. She is an FEI sanctioned veterinarian both as a veterinary judge and treatment veterinarian at international endurance competitions and has served as the Team Veterinarian for the United States Equestrian Federation (USEF) National Endurance Squad. Nancy also judged NATRC competitions for many years. She writes for Equi Management and The





Dr. Rhodes attended the University of California, Davis, and majored in Animal Science. Afterwards, she worked in a research lab and later applied to veterinary school. She completed her internship at Loomis Basin Equine Medical Center prior to returning to UC Davis for her medicine residency which she completed in 2014. Her professional interests include equine medicine, equine opthamology and critical care. When not at the clinic, Dr. Rhodes enjoys multiple outdoor sports.



3. Erin McChesney, Instructor and Rider

Topic: Dressage for the Trail

This presentation is applicable to all trail riders of all levels in how to appropriately include the basics of dressage to enhance their horse's performance overall in distance riding. Through a series of examples and interactive movements, attendees will learn what is helpful, why it's helpful and how to begin including these dressage basics in their training.

Ms. McChesney will provide examples of specific dressage movements that help to prepare the horses for distance work and use interactive segments to get riders "up and moving" to appreciate how they are going to best sit in balance and follow their horses when riding on the trail.



Erin McChesney is an accomplished rider in dressage as well as having competed in NATRC and endurance, including the Tevis Cup. From 1989 to 2007 Erin operated her own training facility, and in that period won both the Tevis Cup and the Haggin Cup (Top awards in the 100-mile Western States Endurance Ride). Erin is one of only three people to have her name on all three cups of the WSTF (Western States Trail Foundation): the Tevis Cup (1991/1996) for the win; the Haggin Cup (1991/1996) for Best Condition and Demonstration of Horsemanship; and the Scripps Cup (1980) for a Tevis junior. She brings together her experience from multiple disciplines and enjoys sharing it with fellow riders.

Region 1 is honored to have these speakers on board for the March 23rd NATRC Region 1 Convention.
