The Ride is sanctioned by the NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE and will be conducted under the rules as published in the 2022 NATRC Rule Book. The following ride divisions are available:

Open "B" 25 to 30 miles on Saturday
Novice/ CP "B1": 20 to 22 miles on Saturday.
Leisure "B1" approximately 10 miles. Saturday only

OPEN Division is timed for a well-conditioned horse that can trot evenly on the flats and walk fast up and down hills. Equines must be 5 years or older.

COMPETITIVE PLEASURE (CP) is for experienced competitors who are no longer eligible to compete in the Novice Division but do not wish to advance to the faster pace and distance of Open. Equines must be 4 years or older.

NOVICE & Leisure Divisions are timed at a brisk and steady walk. Horses must be 4 years or older.

Weight classes for Open, CP and Novice are according to the rider + tack. Lightweight is 189 lbs. or less, heavyweight is 190 lbs. and up. Juniors are 17 years and under, no weight restrictions.

Leisure Division classes are experienced, adult and junior.

Junior Riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian helmet at all times while mounted.

REGULATIONS: You are in competition from the time you present your horse for the pre-ride examination until the final vet check. Check in for O/CP/N rides will start on Friday at 3 pm. A saddle is required on the ride, but there are no restrictions on type. In camp, horses will be trailer-tied in accordance with NATRC rules. Hay or other feed is not available for purchase. Stallions must be double tied and ridden only by an adult. After 10 pm., all should be quiet so we can rest for the next day's ride. Dogs must be on leash and well behaved; absolutely no loose or noisy dogs. All minors under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult in camp, and management strongly suggests juniors be accompanied by an adult on the trail. **ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING ON THE TRAIL.** Water will be available for horses in camp; bring your own to drink. Jackson Forest has no potable water. Camp is far from stores, so bring necessary food and supplies with you. There are no hookups, but toilet facilities are available. If, due to extenuating circumstances, a rider finds it necessary to leave prior to announcement of awards, riders must advise both ride chairman and appropriate division judges (Rulebook Section 5.A.5, p. 5-1).

There will be a potluck dinner on Friday night and a catered dinner on Saturday night. A breakfast of muffins and coffee is free to everyone. We will also have a free Sunday hotdog lunch.

Directions: Go north on 101 from the city of Ukiah for about 15 miles, take the Highway 20 off-ramp into the town of Willits. At the 3rd stoplight turn west on Hwy 20 and proceed west approximately 17 miles on a scenic winding highway. Watch for a sign stating "horse camp" on your right and the historic Little Red Schoolhouse on your left. **Continue on** over a bridge and turn left into the Jackson Forest Day Use area – **MAKE A U TURN THERE** and head back west over the bridge. Turn right onto the forest service road, and left again on the first gravel road. Camp is ¾ mile on the left. There is no real GPS address, if you use a GPS put in the address 15800 State Highway 20, Fort Bragg Ca. That is the Chamberlain Creek Conservation Camp – the U Turn is right across from that. There is very little phone service in the camp so you can't call into camp. If you are arriving on Friday, we will have the turns well marked.

RIDER LIABILITY WAIVER

The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

"I WISH to enter and participate in the Jackson Forest Competitive Trail Ride, to be held at

 Ft. Bragg, CA on August 20th 2022 (date)". "I HAVE READ the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. I AGREE to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. I UNDERSTAND that competitive riding is a high risk activity, which involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or man made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost, or stolen, and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time.

I AGREE to assume all risks associated with my participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, I agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE EVENT TAKES PLACE, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT MY HORSE IS NOT UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF MEDICATION AND WILL NOT BE TREATED WITH OR GIVEN ANY MEDICATION PROHIBITED BY NATRC RULES. I HEREBY GIVE PERMISSION TO THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE OR THEIR DULY APPOINTED AGENT, TO TAKE ANY APPROPRIATE ACTION DEEMED NECESSARY TO CHECK FOR POSSIBLE ADMINISTRATION OF DRUGS TO MY HORSE."

Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.

To the extent any dispute arises out of this agreement, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by the parties, said arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. All such arbitrations shall be held in the county or district where NATRC National headquarters are located. If the prevailing party, NATRC shall be allowed to recover all costs and expenses incurred, including attorney's fees and costs. I also acknowledge the following:

I waive all liability of NATRC and its affiliates for any loss, injury or damage which arises from the “inherent risks” of an equine activity.

“Inherent risks of an equine activity” also means a danger or condition that is an integral part of an equine activity, including, but not limited to, any of the following:

- (a) Propensity of an equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, death, or loss to persons on or around the equine;
- (b) The unpredictability of an equine’s reaction to sounds, sudden movement, unfamiliar objects, person, or other animals;
- (c) Hazards, including, but not limited to, surface or subsurface conditions;
- (d) A collision with another equine, another animal, a person, or an object;
- (e) The potential of an equine activity participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury, death, or loss to the person of the participant or to other persons, including but not limited to, failing to maintain control over an equine or failing to act within the ability of the participant.

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Fun facts about Jackson Demonstration Forest:

Established: 1949

Area: 48,652 acres

Elevation: 80 - 2,200 ft.

Precipitation: 39 in per year along coast, 70 in per year inland

Avg Temperature: 63° F

Jackson is the largest of the state's eight demonstration state forests. Located in the middle of California's coastal redwood region, on the western edge of Mendocino County at Fort Bragg; The area has a long history of industrial logging activity, which began in 1862 and continued under private ownership until the State's purchase of the property in 1947. Today, more forest growth occurs each year than is harvested. The most common tree on the forest is coast redwood, but visitors will also find Douglas fir, grand fir, hemlock, bishop pine, tanoak, alder, madrone and bay myrtle.

Three demonstration trails have been developed with trail guides to inform visitors about the ecology, history and management of the redwood forest. There are also numerous hiking trails situated in historically and ecologically interesting settings, such as the Waterfall Grove Trail and the Forest History Trail. Recreational activities include camping, hiking, biking, horseback riding, swimming and picnicking.

There are two main overnight camping areas with a number of campsites, including equestrian camps. There is no single-use fee for camping. **Campsites have picnic tables, fire rings, and pit toilets. There is no water at the campsites or day use areas. Pets are allowed but must be on a leash.** Permits are required for overnight camping and group events, firewood cutting and mushroom harvesting. Hunting is allowed in season. No fishing is allowed per Department of Fish and Game rules.
